Remember...on **Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> March** we are celebrating World Book Day. We aim to provide the opportunity for everyone to come to school dressed as a book character. The 'fine ' for coming dressed in non-uniform is just £1 and the money raised will go towards our library funds. Everyone who brings in their £1 will be given a raffle ticket which will be entered into our prize draw!

### **Punctuality and attendance**

We are continuing with our successful focus on improving attendance and punctuality. At the half way point of the school year we only have 2 pupils who have attendance below 85% (classified as persistent absentees). This means we have maintained the very low figure which has been our target for this year which is extremely positive!!

We have a few more issues with punctuality and are working with several families to support them in their efforts to get their children to school on time. Ann Cannon (Educational Welfare Officer) is also working with us to address punctuality concerns.

- Year 5 won our overall award for the **best attendance** for the first half of the spring term with an average of 97.89%, narrowly beating Year 1 who managed 97.6% attendance. This is the second time that Year 5 have won the certificate this year well done!
- Year 2 were awarded with a certificate for the best punctuality during the half term they had only 11 'lates' recorded in the first half of the spring term, narrowly beating Year 5 who had 12 congratulations to Year 2 who have now won this certificate twice!!

#### Payments for residential visits in Year 5 and Year 6 – AN IMPORTANT REMINDER!!

If you have a child in Year 5 or Year 6 who is going to be taking part in the Hawkhirst or York visits please remember that the deadline has now passed for the next instalments of the money to be paid.
