World Book Day

We are celebrating World Book Day on **Friday 8th March!** Everyone is invited to come to school dressed in their pyjamas with their favourite 'book at bedtime'. As explained in the letter this week, **the 'fine' for our 'pyjama day' is just £1** and the money raised will go towards our reading book funds. Everyone who brings in their £1 will be given a raffle ticket which will be entered into our prize draw! There will be opportunities for children to share stories with their classmates and other year groups on the day and all children will be given a voucher to take home which they can exchange for a special World Book Day book.

Sports update

We continue to provide as many opportunities as we can for pupils to take part in various sporting activities at Eastlea as part of the ongoing sports partnership work in Cramlington. The support we have from parents in terms of encouraging pupils to attend the range of different clubs/activities on offer is not something we take for granted.



I wanted to make you aware that we have also had real success in securing places for Eastlea pupils in the two 'gifted and talented' sports academy ventures in Cramlington. Two pupils have been taking part in the Dance Academy and 4 pupils were selected to take part in the Multi-skills Academy. For one pupil this is the second time they have been selected and this is a 'first' in Cramlington. Well done to all of them!

PE Kits and School Uniform

So that everyone can continue to take an active part in the PE lessons and sports on offer at Eastlea can we ask that:

- Every child has their PE kit in school <u>all week</u> for PE lessons. As many of the sessions are now outdoors then dark coloured tracksuit bottoms can be worn for warmth and trainers are also required for these lessons.
- Although it is permitted for your child to wear trainers for outdoor PE and to play out at breaks and lunchtimes, they **MUST** have suitable black school shoes to wear in school. Boots with high heels are not appropriate and sitting in full length boots all day can be uncomfortable.

Reading awards

The vast majority of our pupils have been eagerly reading at home as part of our 'Body' reading challenge and getting you to sign their reading records each week. I am delighted to say that so far **149 children** have achieved their Bronze awards and today we presented the first 67 of our silver awards!!

Punctuality and attendance

We are continuing with our successful focus on improving attendance and punctuality. At the half way point of the school year we have only 10 pupils currently at Eastlea who have attendance below 90% (the national classification for persistent absentees). This number has dropped from 21 in October which is positive.

- Year 5 won our overall award for the **best attendance** for the first half of the spring term with an average of 98.13%, beating Year 1 who managed 97.65% attendance. Well done!
- Year 6 were awarded with a certificate for the **best punctuality** during the half term they had 8 'lates' recorded in the first half of the spring term narrowly beating Year 2 who had 9 'lates' followed by Year 1 and Year 5 who both had 11 'lates' congratulations!!

Payments for residential visits in KS2 – AN IMPORTANT REMINDER!!

- Just about all payments for the Year 5 visit to Hawkhirst have now been received thank you. This visit
 is only a few weeks away and parents/carers of pupils in Year 5 will be receiving more details about the

- The deadline for final payments for those children from Year 3/Year 4 who are going to Ford Castle on Tuesday 7th – Wednesday 8th May has now passed. There are a few to chase up and we must have this money quickly as the final invoice for the castle has to be paid in the coming days.
- For those Year 6 children going to York from 3rd 5th June a reminder that the remaining money is due by 29th March. If you are unsure how much is owed then check your payment card or contact Mrs Holdsworth in the school office.

School Meals

The menus for school meals remain the same for this half term and next week, w/b 4th March, is week 2 of the cycle. If you require an additional copy of the current menus, then copies are available from the office.

Computing

We are fortunate to have been given access to a set of 'Spheros' for a fortnight this half term. If your child is talking about programmable robots which whizz across the floor or can follow set patterns and directions this is what they will have been working with in school!

We are always trying to provide lots of opportunities for the children in our Computing lessons as well as regularly reminding the children about E-safety and how to keep themselves safe online:

- Keep passwords private
- Report any concerns to a trusted adult
- Only use games/sites which are age appropriate
- Don't share personal information online
- Be kind when posting comments and images online
