Parents' appointments

Thank you for your tremendous support at the parent appointments which took place this week. Staff still have some parents to see and I know that catch up appointments are being arranged for the coming days. It is always very important to see everyone at this stage of the year – and once again your support is much appreciated.

Update on events before half term:

- Circus Reading Challenge this got off to a flying start last half term and the vast majority of pupils are well on their way towards their bronze award. Any half term reading will count towards the 5th step on the bronze award and we hope to present the first bronze awards in December. If your child is not yet in a good reading routine it is not too late to get started!
- 'Welly Walk' I hope you saw the coverage in the local press following our 'welly walk' fundraising campaign for Farm Africa. We managed to raise £170 for charity and were awarded a certificate for completing 400 welly miles ...even though these were done inside the building rather than on route to church due to the poor weather!
- Spooky Ball Year 5 enterprise project Year 5 did a great job of coordinating 2 Spooky Ball events just before the holiday. The hall was transformed into a suitably spooky venue and the costumes were superb! The photos on the school website are well worth a look!
- School Games GOLD kitemark As I hope you saw in the press just before the half term, we were delighted to be awarded with the gold kitemark for the Sainsbury's School games for 2013-14. This is a huge achievement as we are one of only a handful of schools in the whole county to have achieved this award. It is once again thanks to the successful coordination of PE by Mrs Merryweather, the dedication of all staff who are prepared to take pupils out of school during the day and in the evening, and the enthusiasm of our pupils and sports leaders that we have gained this recognition.



Sport remains high on our agenda for this year as we aim to retain this prestigious gold award – and we endeavour to encourage as many pupils as possible to take part in a variety of events – class festivals, whole school workshops, before/during/after school clubs and team competitions. PE kits

In light of our strong focus on PE/Sport, can I take this opportunity to emphasise how important it is for the children to have a PE kit in school during the week so that whenever PE lessons/sports coaching sessions occur, the children are suitably prepared for their lessons. We have had some difficulties lately with children not having their kit in school and this has meant that they have been unable to take part in planned activities which is upsetting for them and concerning for staff. Your support with this is appreciated.

School lunches - new menus

Eastlea school lunches continue to be popular! The new winter menus will be starting from Monday (week $1 = w/b10^{th}$ November). Copies of the menus are attached to this newsletter for reference as we know how valuable parents find these to plan ahead for when their children want school dinners.

Please can we remind everyone that all lunch money (£2.20 per day/£11.00 per week) for pupils from Year 3 to Year 6 must be paid by first thing on Friday in the week that the meals are eaten to enable the money to be 'balanced'. Unfortunately we still occasionally have some issues with non-payment of dinner money and as a result some families have had to be advised that they will no longer be able to have school lunches and the issue of repayment is then passed to Northumberland County Council.

Attendance and punctuality

In support of our continuing drive to improve attendance and punctuality the 'weekly attendance champions' trophy and 'punctuality' plaque are awarded each week with great excitement! We are continuing to have real success in terms of encouraging good punctuality and attendance at Eastlea. Year 5 have yet to win either trophy – something to aim for this half term!

The 'party poppers' were only used once to celebrate a class gaining their target of 100% attendance – well done to Year 1! I hope we can use them more this half term as well!!

- Year 4 won our overall award for the **best attendance** for the first half of the autumn term in total they won the weekly trophy twice and their average for the half term was 97.91% well done!
- **Year 4** were also awarded with the certificate for the **best punctuality** during the half term only 8 'lates' were recorded in total for this class during the half term very good!
- We have plenty of pupils who are on track to gain individual 100% attendance certificates for the autumn term and I hope they have a healthy seven weeks in the run up to the Christmas holiday!

Children whose percentage attendance falls below 85% are classified by the government as 'persistent absentees' and separate letters have been sent to families of those individuals who fell below this figure in the first half of the autumn term. Letters were also sent to alert families whose children have below 90% attendance so that the issue of 'persistent absence' does not arise.

Peanut allergy

Please note that in future the school must be peanut-free. This includes the school kitchen and all packed lunches/food brought in from home. You will understand that this is to secure the well-being of a child with a recently diagnosed allergy. I hope this will not prove to be too inconvenient.
