★ EASTER CHALLENGE GOLDEN DAY! ★

Today we started the countdown to the next 'Golden Day' which will take place on the day the children break up for the Easter holidays – **Friday 7th April 2017**. The theme for the Golden Day will take the form of an Easter Challenge and we have got several activities planned which we are sure the children will enjoy.

We have been fortunate in securing support from Tracey from **Kidzfit** who together with the Eastlea staff will be leading a range of activities on the day which will all take place in and around the school site.

So what exactly will be happening?

- **A NON-UNIFORM DAY FOR EVERYONE!** (*sporting/casual theme, tracksuits, trainers etc... and no fine to pay!!*)



- Class based **Easter challenges** for different age ranges
- **Hoopstarz workshop** session for most classes led by Tracey from Kidzfit together with a grand finale showcase at the end of the afternoon for Reception to Year 6



- An outdoor obstacle course challenge coordinated by the Sports Council and Mrs Stafford – with edible prizes on offer for teams and/or individuals!
- **Lunchtime arrangements will be in school as usual** for pupils from Reception to Year 6 – so school dinners or packed lunches will be eaten in the school hall following the normal arrangements.
- 3.15pm – usual arrangements for the end of the school day [11.50am end of session for Nursery as usual too!]



And the best news, as always, is that there will be no additional charge for this. **The children do not have to bring in any money for coming in non-uniform, or the Hoopstarz workshop or the Easter challenge activities.** This is their treat for trying hard with their behaviour this half term.

As always attendance on our Golden Days is dependent on each child following the Eastlea rules in school and at lunchtimes. We are hoping to include all children; however, for those who are struggling to follow the rules, we have been or will be in contact with parents to discuss ways to support children to get them 'back on track' in terms of behaviour.
