Well done to them all...there were **142** in total who will be proudly coming home with their gold balloons today! As you can imagine this created a quite a lot of excitement in our assembly this morning!!

- Summer option **blue** check/stripe dress
- Black school shoes NOT trainers please.

P.E. kit

- School tracksuit bottoms/and hoodie (if you have one)
- Plain white t-shirt
- Black shorts
- Trainers
- Younger children can wear black sandshoes or bare feet for indoor P F
