We are celebrating World Book Day on **Thursday 1st March!** Everyone is invited to come to school dressed in their pyjamas with their favourite 'book at bedtime'. **The 'fine' for our 'pyjama day' is just £1** and the money raised will go towards our guided reading book funds. Everyone who brings in their £1 will be given a raffle ticket which will be entered into our prize draw!

Sports update

We continue to provide as many opportunities as we can for pupils to take part in various sporting activities at Eastlea as part of the ongoing sports partnership work in Cramlington. The support we have from parents in terms of encouraging pupils to attend the range of different clubs/activities on offer is not something we take for granted. Last half term we had children taking part in lunchtime football, rugby rocket tots, Bear's Buddies and running clubs, the KS2 before school street dance club, selection events for the Year 5/Year 6 multi-skills academy (well done to Kia who was selected!), swimming



lessons for Year 4, weekly after school tag rugby and tennis sessions, specialist led gymnastics sessions for Year 3/Year 4 and yoga for Early Years, as well as preparation in PE for skipping and gymnastics competitions.

Reading awards

The vast majority of our pupils have been eagerly reading at home as part of our 'Sport' reading challenge and getting you to sign their reading records each week. I am delighted to say that so far **148 children have achieved their Bronze awards** and today we presented the **first 48 of our silver awards**!!

Ninja maths awards

As you will see from the 'events calendar' above we will be awarding our maths awards and Ninja certificates at a special assembly on 20th March. **We cannot emphasise enough how important it is to encourage your child to learn their times tables as it makes the job of completing calculations in maths so much easier.** The first ones to learn are x2, x10 and x5 then this moves on to include x 3, x4, x 6, x8, x7, x9, x11 and x12. By the end of Year 4 it is expected all children will know all their times tables (up to the 12x12). After that the children will move on to division facts. There is a big focus on this in school, but any help you can give your child in learning their tables can make a huge impact. If you are unsure how to go about this, then speak to your child's teacher and they will be happy to share further strategies and approaches which may be useful. Thank you in advance!

Punctuality and attendance

We are continuing with our successful focus on improving attendance and punctuality. At the half way point of the school year we had 16 pupils currently at Eastlea who have attendance below 90% (the national classification for persistent absentees). This number has dropped from 20 in October and 18 at Christmas which is positive.

- Year 6 won our overall award for the **best attendance** for the first half of the spring term with an average of 99.2%, beating Year 3 who managed 96.48% attendance. Well done!
- Year 6 were also awarded with a certificate for the **best punctuality** during the half term they had only 1 'late' recorded in the first half of the spring term which is a fantastic achievement; the next closest were Year 2 and Year 5 who both had 6 'lates' congratulations!!

School Meals

The menus for school meals remain the same for this half term and next week w/b 26th February is week 2 of the cycle. If you require an additional copy of the current menus, then copies are available from the office. The summer menu will probably be starting after Easter and this will be discussed with the cook and further details will be shared with parents at the end of term.

PE Kits and School Uniform

- Please can we remind everyone that it saves a lot of time in searching for kit if every child has their PE kit in school <u>all week</u> for PE lessons. As many of the sessions are now outdoors then dark coloured tracksuit bottoms can be worn for warmth and trainers are also required for these lessons.
- If you wish your child to wear trainers to play out at breaks and lunchtimes this is permitted, but they **MUST** have suitable black school shoes to wear in school. Boots with high heels are not appropriate and sitting in full length boots all day can be uncomfortable.
- We pride ourselves on having a smart Eastlea school uniform and the owl logo on our navy blue sweatshirts and sports kits for those representing the school is universally recognised! Although we aim to keep the price of sweatshirts/cardigans to the lowest we can, at certain times it can be difficult for some families to purchase brand new school uniform for their children. We are therefore delighted to be part of a venture which aims to help support families when they need it to ensure their child(ren) are always smartly dressed in school uniform – see overleaf.
