

Dear Parents / Carers,

Covid update

On Friday this week the children break up for the February half term holiday after a busy 7 weeks. It has not been the easiest of half terms and since our return in January we have had higher numbers of Covid cases to deal with than at any other time since the start of the pandemic. I wanted to say **THANK YOU** to everyone for your support over recent weeks.

At various times, each year group has faced the issue of cases spreading within their class, which has impacted both members of staff and other pupils. This has meant additional testing as 'close contacts' for everyone in the class as well as supply staff having to be deployed at short notice to teach/support the children. This is not an easy situation but almost every family has followed our suggested precautions and for this we are very grateful. Many of you have gone above and beyond in trying to protect the Eastlea community, e.g. by keeping children off school with any sign of illness, seeking PCR tests as a precaution at the first hint of any symptoms and keeping siblings off school due to positive cases within your household. THANK YOU!

The range of symptoms leading to a positive COVID case has been diverse to say the least – we have seen the 'standard' symptoms of cough/high temperature/loss of taste…but more commonly something outside of this list such as a sore throat, headache, stomach pain, sickness or in many cases NO SYMPTOMS at all. This has made it especially hard to spot cases and we have been reliant on the vigilance of not only the staff, but also you as parents overseeing your children taking regular lateral flow tests.

We do not yet know what changes to national guidance we may face in the coming weeks and how this will impact on the risk assessments and procedures in school, but we will let you know as soon as we have clear guidelines.

Fundraising 'thank you'

- Remembrance poppy day we received notification last week that the Eastlea community had raised £219.56 for the Royal British Legion in November. Thank you!
- Our NSPCC Number Day on Friday 4th February was a big success and we raised £145 which has been split between the NSPCC and school maths funds. I know the children had great fun with their Maths Week and especially enjoyed the dress up Number Day – with some very inventive maths based outfits. Thank you for your support.

PE kits

Brainwaves suggestion for pupils to come to school dressed in their PE kit on days they have PE seems to have been well received by almost all parents and children. Remember <u>PLAIN</u> dark navy/black tracksuit bottoms and school sweatshirts are required on PE days (if these days are going to alter after half term your child's class teacher will let you know!) We have been asked by several parents whether we are going to look into getting some Eastlea tracksuits as a PE kit option for these days. This is something that the Brainwaves <u>ARE</u> now looking into and we will let you know when we have further details.

Parking concerns

There are still some problems being caused for local residents due to parking on streets surrounding the school. We realise that it can be hectic at the drop off and collection times, but some cars are being parked on either side of very narrow roads which means that other vehicles simply cannot get through. This is of concern to local residents and other families but also a real issue of safety as if there was the need for access by an emergency vehicle I fear that they simply would be unable to get through.



Please can we again ask that those who come to school by car park responsibly, without blocking residents access to their homes or on narrow roads and do not leave cars unattended for extended periods. Thank you for your support with this.

 games Year 3 multi-skills finals. This was a virtual event which involved the whole class. Year 3 had
 done an amazing job to win their area competition and they did themselves proud in the county finals –

- Last week **Year 6** did a super job of 'showcasing' Eastlea in their '**Our School**' page published in the Evening Chronicle. This was the culmination of their journalistic writing project and they were very excited to see their names in print! The articles written were superb!

The rangers who will be leading this topic visited Eastlea last week and in March we will be able to share more details with you about this exciting project we are the only Northumberland school who were chosen to take part!

FSM vouchers

We have again been informed by the county that food vouchers will be available over the half term holiday for those families eligible for benefit based free school meals. Please look out for an email notification which will be sent out this week so that you can activate and use the vouchers over the holiday period.

School Uniform and Food Bank referrals

We are very much aware of the increased costs of living, e.g. energy prices etc which are impacting everyone at the moment. If you or anyone you know requires additional support then a reminder that:

- School Uniform can be obtained FREE of charge from the HOPE CENTRE in Cramlington. Clean, good quality school uniform such as sweatshirts/cardigans, trousers, skirts, shoes, PE kit, coats etc for all the local schools (including Eastlea and CLV) can be obtained and there is lots available. The Hope Centre is open for uniform to be collected on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays from 10am 2pm (and now Wednesdays too). There is no need for a referral you can just turn up or contact them by email to see what they have on offer.
- Cramlington Foodbank parcels are also available to those
 who may find this useful. A referral from school can be made
 so please talk to a member of staff in confidence if this would
 be helpful and we will do our best to support you.

 favourite book for some reading themed activities in school on that day. A reminder
