



# ★ EASTER GOLDEN DAY! ★

Today we started the countdown to the next 'Golden Day' which will take place on the day the children break up for the Easter holidays – **Friday 31<sup>st</sup> March 2023**. As a follow up to our RE theme day based on the Easter story which will take place next week, the staff are planning an 'Easter themed' Golden Day and there will be several fun activities during the day which we are sure that the children will enjoy.

## So what exactly will be happening?

- **A NON-UNIFORM DAY FOR EVERYONE!** (*no particular theme – just something casual...and NO fine to pay!!*)
- Class based **Easter craft activities and challenges** for different age ranges
- **Easter games** such as 'pin the tail on the bunny' etc
- An **Easter egg hunt** – within the school grounds – fingers crossed for some spring like weather!
- **Easter raffle to be drawn...** tickets for this were sent home earlier this week – and there are more available from the school office if anyone wants them!
- **Lunchtime arrangements will be in school as usual** – so school dinners or packed lunches will be eaten in the school hall following the normal arrangements.
- **For all pupils from Reception to Year 6 (plus full day Nursery pupils) we will finish the day early for our Easter holidays and the children will head home at 2pm** (I think they see this as the biggest treat of all!!) [*Morning Nursery pupils should be collected at 11.50am as usual*]



And the best news, as always, is that there will be no additional charge for the activities on the day. **The children do not have to bring in any money for coming in non-uniform, or the Easter activities.** This is their treat for trying hard with their behaviour this half term.

As always attendance on our Golden Days is dependent on each child following the Eastlea rules in school and at lunchtimes. We are hoping to include all children; however, for those who are struggling to follow the rules, we have been or will be in contact with parents to discuss ways to support children to get them 'back on track' in terms of behaviour.
