Educational visits

For those classes with educational visits still to take place, pupils will have/had separate letters to provide more information about the details and price of these events – so look out for these! As in previous years the school will be subsidising the transport costs/price for activities as far as we can to keep the cost for parents as low as possible. All of them have been planned to extend the learning of the pupils linked to their humanities/arts/topic work so we hope that all children will be able to take part.

School budget situation

As I'm sure you will be aware, school budgets are being faced with national cuts (in common with lots of other areas in the public sector). We continue to strive to provide as many experiences as we possibly can for the children at Eastlea but are 'feeling the pinch' and are having to embark on some more fundraising ventures to help us to further develop and extend what we offer the children. We are always very grateful for the support of parents/carers and the extended network of 'friends of Eastlea' who attend our fayres, performances, curriculum events etc in such large numbers – we really appreciate this high level of support.

One of the biggest things which would help at the moment, would be to attract more families/children to Eastlea. We get such positive comments from parents/carers and know how highly you value what we offer here in terms of a broad and <u>ENJOYABLE</u> 'educational experience', but we need to widen this out and encourage more children to join us. Do you know anyone who is undecided about where to send their child to school? Are there families living around your area who might consider coming to see what Eastlea has to offer? We are going to be launching an advertising initiative to get our name known more widely – in the new housing developments, community groups, local businesses etc and if anyone could support us with this – delivering leaflets, spreading the word or sharing information we would be very grateful.

A couple of examples of what we are trying to do:

- The new Owlets Parent and Toddler Group on Thursday mornings is being overseen by Mrs
 Holdsworth, and run by some parent volunteers and we want to attract as many people as possible
 to come to this group so that they can get into school and make friends/contacts with people in the
 area
- Sprucing up the front of the school/outdoor areas we have the town council planter at the front of the school, the no-smoking area at the gates and an ongoing fundraising campaign to get some more signage for the school to welcome families and make the access areas more attractive. We are also looking at the possibility of having an extra gateway/entrance and perhaps even 'sponsoring the nearby 'underpass' (but this may take some time as the county council are involved!!)

As part of this we want to make the gateways/doorways/school approach paths calmer at the start of the school day. Many families have started to arrive earlier and earlier for school which leads to some younger children getting irritable while they wait for the doors to open with their parents, and groups of older pupils congregating outside the front of the school and by the doors. I know you are all keen to get here in the morning, but long periods of standing around at the gates or the doorways can lead to games getting out of hand which is then unsafe and can be tricky to manage. Please can we ask that you do not arrive too early in the mornings, and if your child walks/cycles independently to school then don't let them set off too early! 8.40am is early enough as the doors do not open until 8.50am.

Punctuality and attendance

• The weekly attendance champions' trophy and punctuality plaque winners for the six weeks of the first half of the summer term are included in the table below:

- Year 2 won our overall award for the best attendance for the first half of the summer term and their average for the half term was 97.83% well done! Year 6 were second with 97.65%.
- Year 6 won the certificate for the **best punctuality** during the half term congratulations! Year 2 were second and Year 5 were third.
- As a school we try hard to maintain a low level of 'persistent absentees'. We have only 12 pupils currently at Eastlea with **attendance below 90%** which is something we are very pleased with.

Sunny weather and uniform reminders...!

We have a large number of sporting events as you can see from the calendar above, so PE kit is regularly required for all children – and is probably best kept in school for ease of access whenever required. Many girls are choosing to wear blue striped/checked summer dresses and this is fine, but please can we ask that leggings are not worn as school uniform – they are not appropriate for school. School shoes rather than trainers are still expected when in school.

We hope to have plenty of summery weather in the coming weeks. Please can we also remind you to apply sun cream where required for your child before they come to school and remember that named bottles of water are allowed for PE lessons or sporting activities.
