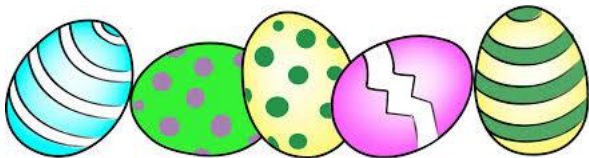
We are very grateful to you for:
