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Sport Premium Funding Update

This newsletter brings to a close breadth of PE and Sport offered. the third year that 7 Cramlington Primary Schools have pooled their Primary Sport Premium funding, to work in partnership to offer the pupils of Cramlington an increasing range of sporting opportunities and experiences. It has been confirmed that the Primary Sport Premium funding will continue in 2016-17.

In addition, from September 2017 the Government intend to use the "sugar tax" to double funding for primary school sport, which will enable the schools to do more to support healthier, more active lifestyles and make further improvements to the quality and

This year, the Cramlington School Sport Partnership has arranged and supported 20 whole year group Sports Festivals, 450 hours of extra-curricular coaching, almost 500 hours of specialist teaching/coaching to support curriculum PE lessons, 14 Level 2 School Games competitions for KS2 pupils, saw 8 teams progressing to the Level 3 county finals where teams won 3 bronze and 1 silver medal, 35 hours of leadership training, 17 hours of elite coaching for gifted and talented performers, and organised and paid for 57 buses



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to get pupils to all of these events! What a busy year!

We have ended this successful year with 6 schools achieving the School Games Gold Award. This is due to the ongoing commitment from the school PE Coordinators and staff, and the enthusiasm of the children. Congratulations to all schools and thank you to everyone who is playing a part in making this an exciting period for primary school PE and sport.

Level 2 School Games Competitions

This year's School Games programme has seen 14 Level 2 (inter-school) competitions. The winners from each of these competitions progressed to the Northumberland School Games Level 3 finals:

Year 6 Hockey

22 teams, including representation from all of the Cramlington Partnership schools, took part in the Y6 hockey competition held at Cramlington Learning Village. The fast and furious competition demonstrated very good skill-levels and was played with excellent sportsmanship. Beaconhill played against Hareside in the final, with Beaconhill winning the competition.

Y5/6 Rugby

10 teams from B e a c o n h i l l , Burnside, Eastlea, Northburn and Shanklea battled the wet weather in the Y5/6 Tag Rugby



competition, held at Astley HS. Seaton Sluice Middle School won the competition, with **Northburn** finishing as runners-up.

Y3/4 Rugby

9 Cramlington teams, from **Beaconhill, Burnside, Eastlea, Northburn** and **Shanklea,** competed with the Seaton Valley first schools in the Y3/4 Rugby competition. **Shanklea** progressed to the semi-finals, with New Hartley First School winning the competition.

Year 5/6 Athletics

18 teams, from all 7 schools, competed in cold and windy conditions in the Quad Kids competition. Each athlete completes

a standing long jump, howler throw, 60m sprint and 600m long run, with

distances and times converted into team points. Shanklea finished the day as the team with the highest points total, with Burnside in 2nd place.



Year 3/4 Athletics

The Y3/4 athletics competition also uses the Quad Kids format, but is a virtual competition, where children take place in the activities in school and their best results are submitted for the competition. This year's competition was entered by Cragside, Eastlea and Shanklea, along with schools from Seaton Valley, with Cragside finishing in 1st place and Eastlea in 3rd.

Year 4 Tennis

Teams from Beaconhill, Burnside, Cragside, Hareside, Northburn and Shanklea competed in the Y4 tennis, hosted by Cramlington Community Tennis Programme at Alexandra Park. Players take part in individual matches where every point scored contributes to their team's score. Hareside were the overall winners.

Level 3 Northumberland School Games

The 5th Northumberland Level 3 School Games Finals were held in Cramlington on 21st and 22nd June. The event, sponsored by The Education Network, sees hundreds of athletes from across Northumberland competing in a range of sports, with each team having qualified by winning their area's Level 2 competition during the year. Each day of the School Games starts with an opening ceremony, this year hosted by Olympic gymnast Craig Heap, England Rugby Union player Tamara Taylor and world champion boxer Glenn McCrory. Eastlea Primary's Singing Club also performed a song which had been specially written for the opening ceremony. Athletes then parade to Cramlington Learning Village, accompanied by mascots from the 6 areas of the county and entertained en-route by singing and dancing performances, including fantastic music from Northburn and Hareside. Schools nominated pupils to be the flag begrers for their area, and this year pupils from Cragside and Beaconhill were selected for the honour.





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Y3 and Y5 Cricket Festivals

This year marked the third annual cricket festivals for pupils in Y3 and Y5, arranged and hosted by Cramlington Cricket Club. This year's festivals, held in June, were unfortunately hit by poor weather which resulted in 3 events having to be cancelled. The festivals that went ahead saw hundreds of children taking part in fun cricket skills and

games, led by volunteers from the club and sports leaders from Cramlington Learning Village.
