#### Uniform - PE kits

We should hopefully be due some better weather this term which means that the PE sessions for most classes will be taking place outside. It is therefore important that pupils have their PE kits in school each week and this should include black shorts, plain white t-shirt and trainers. Plain dark tracksuits could also be brought to wear. It is very important that all PE kit is clearly labelled with your child's name – as this will save lots of delays and frustrations at the beginning of PE sessions!

### **Punctuality and attendance**

Thanks to your continuing support we are continuing to have real success in terms of encouraging good punctuality and attendance at Eastlea. Here are the 'headlines' from last half term:

• The weekly attendance champions' trophy and punctuality plaque winners for the five weeks of the second half of the spring term are included in the table below:

- Year 3 won our overall award for the best attendance for the second half of the spring term they reached 100% twice. Their average for the half term was 98.08% well done!
- **Reception** were awarded with the certificate for the **best punctuality** during the half term only 5 'lates' was recorded during the half term. This is the first time that Reception have won either of the half term awards congratulations!
- Our analysis has shown that the total of 'lates' was again reduced across the whole school during the previous half term – which we are delighted about!
- We also had some individuals from across the school who managed to maintain full attendance and excellent punctuality for a whole of the spring term. I am delighted to announce that the total for last term was once again very high with 51 pupils being awarded with special certificates for 100% attendance in the spring term. 22 of them are on track for a full year of 100% attendance having not missed a day in either the autumn or spring terms...good luck!!

- In terms of what is currently classed nationally as 'persistent absence' the number of pupils at Eastlea with attendance below 85% has been kept to a minimum... there are only 5 pupils (currently attending Eastlea) out of the whole school. This is a great achievement and we are working with these families to reduce the figure even further!
- For your information, from September, the national classification for 'persistent absence' is going to change to **below 90%** and it has been our policy in recent years to alert parents when attendance falls below this figure (currently we have an additional 10 children with below 90% attendance).

#### Eastlea school Lunches - new menus

The new 'summer menus' for school lunches will be starting in the week beginning Monday 27<sup>th</sup> April. The new weekly menus will be available for your reference when they begin. Until then the previous menus are continuing – it will be 'week 2' next week.

### **Parking**

Please can I take this opportunity to remind you again about the importance of parking carefully around the vicinity of the school. It is important not to block paths and driveways with cars as this can cause problems for local residents and other pedestrians. We have contacted the council to see what can be done about the overgrown bushes which are also inhibiting access to paths near the carpark areas – but request your help to ensure that the pathways are not blocked by cars. # ICT update - School360

I have been asked by Mrs Atkinson and Mrs Powells (ICT coordinators) to explain that the new learning platform for ICT in school has been launched recently with the children. The older 'Nortle system' is now no longer available. In order for School360 to run successfully then **Google Chrome** is required. If you have the facility to access this at home then it is <u>free</u> and safe to download and will mean that your child can access the School360 learning platform via their password which they have been/will be allocated in school.
