

Dear Parents/Carers.

This week we are coming to the end of the first half of the autumn term and once again we have had a very busy, active and enjoyable time since the children returned in September.

## Thank you for supporting our Active October and other school events

In the 7 weeks of this half term there has been such a lot happening and every event has been well supported by parents/carers/the wider school community. This is something for which we are very grateful.

- The launch of our Disney themed reading challenge saw £180 raised from contributions made by the children for our reading resources. Most children have made a good start to the reading challenge and are getting their weekly stickers on their bookmarks for reading at home, getting their reading record books signed and completing the reading activities in KS2. It was fantastic to welcome so many of you to our launch event last month THANK YOU! Remember that all children are asked to read over the half term holiday next week (or practise their letter sounds in Reception) and this will ensure they get their next star on the bronze bookmark!
- Over the summer holiday we had our highest total yet of children who had taken part in the libraries summer reading challenge.
   46 Eastlea pupils gained a Gadgeteers certificate and medal and they were rewarded with a reading celebration picnic thanks to Mrs Lister a couple of weeks ago. Thanks to everyone who supported their child with this challenge over the 6 weeks holiday.
- I think you will agree that our new team of Brainwaves have planned a superb 3 weeks of activity for the
  rest of the school. Each week in October they have outlined their plans to the children in assembly.
  Thank you for keeping a note of the extra days where PE kits have been required and supporting
  everything that has taken place throughout Active October:
  - ➤ Week 1: Walk to school week with Robot stickers for those arriving on foot, Hoopstarz/Skateboarding/Judo workshops and our Eastlea Countryfile Ramble for Children in Need (£118 raised) and the Cramlington Foodbank (17 crates of food donated);
  - Week 2: Stay safe and healthy week with luminous feet/clips for those using the Church of the Nazarene carpark, Little Movers/Jui Jitsu/Lawn bowls/acrobatics workshops, Sainsbury's healthy eating sessions, KS1 playground festival led by our Y6 sports leaders and dog safety workshops for all classes;
  - ➤ Week 3: **Bike to school week** with high viz pencils/prizes for those coming to school on bikes/scooters, **Hoopstarz/Jui Jitsu/Volleyball** workshops, new playground bikes for the younger children, the start of bike club for Y5/Y6, **Road safety** workshops, a rugby festival for Y4 and completion of the 'mini-London marathon'.

N.B. Even though the Active October focus has finished we are still keen to promote further use of the Park and Stride facility from the Church of the Nazarene. Parking is so much easier there and the children seem to enjoy the few minutes walk along the path, under the underpass and up to the school gates. If you have not used it yet, it really is worth a try to avoid parking headaches nearer the school.

• The first whole school face to face parent appointments since 2019 were extremely well attended and there was a really positive atmosphere in the hall on Thursday last week. Thanks to Revd Wullie who led an assembly during the morning. We had a great day and the children seemed to thoroughly enjoy our new approach to the subject. It certainly generated lots of questions!

### Positive feedback for Eastlea pupils

We consistently remind children of the importance of good behaviour and have high expectations of the pupils both in school and when they are out and about. It is always lovely to receive positive feedback and we have had some lovely comments recently from adults working with the children who have praised their enthusiasm and attitude.



#### **HUGGG** half term vouchers

Thanks to additional government funding, families entitled to benefit based free school meals will again receive an email/link from school to enable them to access a £20 HUGGG voucher for groceries etc over the half term break. Supermarket vouchers can be used for groceries or uniform/clothing if these are available in store.





As far as we are aware all Year 6 parents have now made an application on the Northumberland admissions portal to secure their child a place in Year 7 for September 2023. If anyone has <u>not</u> yet done this then the portal is still open and any remaining applications need to be submitted straight away (the deadline is 31<sup>st</sup> October). It is essential that you apply before the deadline so that a place is allocated at Cramlington Learning Village or the secondary school of your choice.

For parents of pupils due to start in Reception <u>next</u> September the admissions portal opens on 1<sup>st</sup> November and closes on 15<sup>th</sup> January – *you will receive confirmation of places on 17<sup>th</sup> April 2023.* Please note that <u>even if your child is currently attending our Eastlea Nursery then you must make an admissions application for a place in Reception September 2023</u>. The information about this is all on the Northumberland County Council website (school admissions).
