Bikes and scooters

I'm sorry to have to report that we seem to have a problem emerging in terms of bikes going missing from the school premises. One was stolen a while ago from outside the front of the school – the police were informed but although we had a description of the culprit the bike was never found. More recently two bikes have gone missing – both were in the bike racks provided but were left unlocked. Once again the police are aware of the situation and are increasing their patrols but it is not pleasant to think that someone is coming onto our property and stealing items belonging to children. If anyone has any information then please let staff or the police know.

The police crime prevention team have advised that bikes or scooters without locks should not be brought to school so please can we insist that any bikes and scooters brought to Eastlea are <u>LOCKED</u> securely to the bike racks provided so that no more instances like this can occur.

Parent Mail – text updates for parents

Following the parental questionnaire which we asked you to complete in the autumn term, one of the issues raised was whether a facility for 'text message' alerts could be provided for parents/carers. We have looked into this service previously but were not impressed by what was on offer. However, I am pleased to say that 'Parent Mail' now have what seems a workable service and we have subscribed to this for a year as a trial measure starting after half term.

In practise this will mean that we have the facility to send out a text message 'alert' to the primary mobile contacts for each family/child to inform everyone quickly of important information. We do not intend to use this service for daily or weekly reminders, but will do so for unscheduled or one—off events, e.g. if we are ever in the position again to have to close Eastlea due to bad weather, or as a reminder on the day of our parent appointments, or to let families know if a school visit is delayed, or a residential visit has arrived safely etc.

Parent Mail will make use of the contacts we have held on our school system so it is vital that if you change a mobile number that you inform us immediately to that we have the most up-to-date numbers available.

There will be no facility to reply to the text service and there will be no charge for this for parents. We hope that this will improve even further our communication with parents/carers and would welcome your feedback on the new system when it is operational.
