World Book Day

Remember we are celebrating World Book Day, tomorrow – **Friday 3rd March!** Everyone is invited to come to school dressed in their pyjamas with their favourite 'book at bedtime'. **The 'fine' for our 'pyjama day' is just £1** and the money raised will go towards our guided reading book funds. Everyone who brings in their £1 will be given a raffle ticket which will be entered into our prize draw!

Reading awards

The vast majority of our pupils have been eagerly reading at home as part of our 'Around the UK' reading challenge and getting you to sign their reading records each week. I am delighted to say that **173 children have now achieved their Bronze award** and this week we presented the **first 69 of our silver awards!!**

Punctuality and attendance

We are continuing with our successful focus on improving attendance and punctuality. At the half way point of the school year we have 18 pupils currently at Eastlea who have attendance below 90% (the national classification for persistent absentees). This number has dropped from 28 in October and 19 at Christmas which is positive.

- **Year 5** won our overall award for the **best attendance** for the first half of the spring term with an average of 98.21%, beating Year 6 who managed 97.34% attendance. Well done!
- **Year 5** were also awarded with a certificate for the **best punctuality** during the half term – they had 5 'lates' recorded in the first half of the spring term; the next closest was Reception who had 7 'lates' – congratulations!!

Payments for residential visits in KS2 – AN IMPORTANT REMINDER!!

If you have a child in Year 3/Year 4 or Year 5 who is going to Ford Castle or Hawkthirst then the deadline has now passed for final payments to be made for these visits.

Those children going to York in Year 6 should now have paid £75, with the remaining money due by 27th March. Please contact the school office if you have missed the deadline or there is a problem with payment as we have to confirm and pay the final invoices for all the many activities which are on offer.

PE Kits/School uniform

Please can we remind everyone that it saves a lot of time in searching for kit if every child has their PE kit in school all week for PE lessons. As many of the sessions are now outdoors then dark coloured tracksuit bottoms can be worn for warmth and trainers are also required for these lessons. If you wish your child to wear trainers to play out at breaks and lunchtimes this is permitted, but they **MUST** have suitable black school shoes to wear in school. Boots with high heels are not appropriate and sitting in full length boots all day can be uncomfortable.

Buggies at the gates/entranceways

A couple of people have mentioned that it can be difficult to get into the school gates if they are 'blocked' by people standing with buggies in front of the pathways/openings. Is it possible to ask that more space can be made for people to be able to get through – perhaps by parents gathering further away from the school gates, especially at the start and end of the school day. Thank you!
