## Computer Reading Challenge!

Our Times Tables Rockstars theme is a continuation of the challenge which some children started last year and which proved so popular. It is for **pupils from Year 2 to Year 6 only** and we will be explaining how this will work to the children in school on the 'launch day'. Year 1 will be doing a slightly different version of the challenge at their 'level'!







As always we want to 'launch' both of our challenges in style – so we have the following activities planned in school on 27<sup>th</sup> September...

1. Friday 27<sup>th</sup> September will be a non-uniform day for all pupils – we hope to see as many children as possible (and staff!) coming dressed with either a 'Computers' or 'Rockstars' theme – I hope this gives plenty of possibilities! The 'fine' for coming in non-uniform is £1 per child. The money raised will be split between our 'reading books fund' and our 'maths resources fund'. Everyone who brings in their '£1' fine will also have their name entered into a prize draw for a chocolate reward!!



- 2. At a school assembly that morning the organisation of the reading and rockstars challenges will be outlined so that everyone knows what they are aiming for.
- 3. We are also inviting parents/carers of pupils from Reception (including 30 hour Nursery) up to Year 6 to come into school during the afternoon (from 2.15pm) [or 11.30am for 15 hour Nursery pupils] so that you can:
  - find out about the reading and Times Tables Rockstars challenges for the different year groups
  - share a book with your child(ren) to get them started on the bronze bookmark
  - get details about the reading and maths and general homework expectations for your child this year
  - ask any questions you may have!

We very much hope you can support your child with this event and look forward to seeing you on the day.
