- Our Year 4 gymnastics team took part in the school games competition at the new Northburn Gymnastics centre. They came 4th overall which was a huge achievement. Our Year 5/Year 6 badminton team also represented us well at the festival last week.
- Year 3 and Year 5 classes were both delighted to represent 'Cramlington and Seaton Valley' in the school games multi-skills county finals. Having both come second in their regional events they did themselves proud in the finals, competing against schools from across Northumberland well done!
- Year 2 have done a fantastic job with their Castles homework project. The range of items which are proudly carried in by excited children each week has been amazing. Thank you for your support!
- Year 6 received excellent feedback after their visit to Nissan this week. They had made some very creative wind turbines which they took with them on the day as part of the eco-school activities. Very well designed!

School Uniform ... FREELY available from the Hope Centre

We have recently been sent a reminder that clean, good quality school uniform such as sweatshirts/cardigans, trousers, skirts, pinafores, shoes, PE kit, coats etc for all the local schools (including Eastlea and CLV) can be obtained free of charge from the Hope Centre in Cramlington. There is no need for a referral – just turn up on Monday to Friday 10am – 2pm to see what is available.

We have again been informed by the county that vouchers will be available over the February half term holiday for those families eligible for benefit based free school meals. An email notification has been sent out this week so that you can activate and use the vouchers over the holiday period.

IMPORTANT: NEU Strike Action update

As outlined in the letter about teachers strikes earlier this half term, a decision about the implications for schools on each day of any proposed



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strike action has to be taken separately. The second day of NEU strike action is due to take place in the first week back after half term on Tuesday 28th February 2023. This will result in some partial or whole school closures in the north of the country.

After discussions with the staff in school, I am pleased to inform you that it looks as though Eastlea Primary will again be fully open for all pupils on Tuesday 28th February so children in all classes should attend school as normal on that day. As before, if anything changes I will aim to let parents/carers know as soon as possible.

Residential visits for Year 5/Year 6

The response to the Year 5 residential visit to Hawkhirst has been excellent and their visit is confirmed for $17^{\text{th}} - 19^{\text{th}}$ April. Reading Challenge, books and World Book Day

- At the end of this week we will be presenting the first of the silver awards for the whole school 'Disney Reading Challenge'. If your child reads over the half term break and has their reading record signed then this will count as a sticker on their latest bookmark. Please encourage them to keep reading!
- We have been investing a lot of money in replacing and updating reading books across the school. All children are encouraged to look after the books that they take home as they can be very costly to replace. In Year 3 and Year 4 we understand that fewer children have reading folders/book bags and staff have noticed that some reading books are becoming water damaged having been stored in school bags alongside water bottles. We are looking at alternatives and will send a separate letter home to Year 3 and Year 4 after the half term. Water bottles and reading books are obviously both needed, but can we ask that water bottles are <u>not</u> transported in school bags to help protect the books. Thank you!
- At the end of the first week back after the half term break it is World Book Day which we will be celebrating on <u>FRIDAY 3rd MARCH</u>. At Eastlea children are again encouraged to come to school in their pyjamas/dressing gowns and/or onesies together with their favourite book for some reading themed activities in school on that day. We will also be teaming up with Usborne to launch a sponsored read event on that day...so we can raise further funds to gain FREE Usborne books in school. Further details will be sent out after the holiday.



• We have also been working behind the scenes to set up an e-books subscription for some classes. This will be free to use but we need a bit more time to see exactly how it will work in practice. Again further details will be shared when we are sorted!

Coronation bank holiday – advance notice

As you will be aware, the coronation of King Charles III takes place on Saturday 6th May 2023. An additional bank holiday has been awarded for the whole country on the Monday following this weekend. This will be on <u>Monday 8th May 2023</u>. Please note that on this day Eastlea will therefore be closed for all pupils and staff.
