

Dear Parents/Carers,

Friday marks the end of the first half of the summer term, which means that when we return after the half term break we will have only 7 weeks left of this school year. The time is flying! This letter includes a few updates and reminders before the children break up on Friday.

# Y6 SATs and writing moderation

Our Year 6 children have worked incredibly hard and should be very proud of themselves. Last week they completed their national assessments in reading, maths arithmetic/reasoning plus 'SPaG'. This was their chance to 'show off' everything they have learned throughout Key Stage 2 and they did just that — well done to them all! In a few weeks time their written work will be 'moderated' in discussion with staff from another school. This is something they are now looking ahead to and working hard to make sure their writing is the very best that it can be.

### Children's Cancer Run

The weather on Sunday was cooler than recent years but fine for 'running'. 29 pupils from our Year 4/Year 5/Year 6 running club together with staff, plus other family members and ex-pupils took part in the Cancer Run at Gosforth Park. They seemed delighted with their purple t-shirts and medals awarded for completion of the race. As always, our owl banner could be seen at the finish line and thanks to Mrs Scott for the chocolate owl cake – very tasty indeed! Well done and thanks to everyone who supported this event!

## Out and about - representing Eastlea

In recent weeks we have had <u>lots</u> of children out and about, or in school, representing Eastlea at a range of different events and activities. We are always delighted to receive positive feedback on the attitude, behaviour and enthusiasm shown by our pupils – something we expect, but <u>never</u> take for granted!

- Reception had fantastic feedback from the staff at Whitehouse Farm on their class visit last month, as
  did Year 2 when they completed a workshop linked to their Castles, Kings and Queens topic at
  Newcastle Castle. This has inspired the children to make some marvellous creations as part of their
  homework project well done!
- Year 3 loved their visit to St James' Park and came back with lots to share about their experiences in the ground and on the rooftop 4G pitch.
- A group of Brainwaves were chosen to speak to the judges from Northumbria in Bloom to explain how
  the painted underpass project had come about. The judges were very impressed and loved the
  colourful designs which have helped to brighten our local community.
- Year 4 went out to complete some 'field work' in Horton Park and were praised by those they
  interviewed for their approach and good manners. Brilliant!
- Our Y3/Y4 Quad athletics teams took part in events at Astley
  High and came back covered in stickers which showed the school
  games values they had demonstrated during the morning.
  Unfortunately, the Y5/Y6 athletics event was called off this week due to the wet weather!
- The 3 Northumbria University students who completed the Stormbreak project with classes across the school and invited Year 3/Year 4 to a team building festival at Newbiggin were very impressed with the friendliness of the pupils (and staff)!!
- A small group of **Y3/Y4 mathematicians** spent today with other KS2 pupils at Shanklea further improving their reasoning and problem-solving skills.
- The children attending **Nursery** on Monday morning were treated to a storytelling workshop brought to life by Ashleigh from Adventure Babies with fibre optic lights and star torches a magical 'early' Golden Day experience for our youngest children.
- Year 6 visited Nissan for their Monozukuri Caravan workshop last month and then returned on Tuesday for the Eco-school session, laden with wind turbines they had designed and made themselves. This was followed by a visit from Connor, from the Northumberland College green skills team, who reinforced their knowledge of the use of wind turbines and renewable energy in Northumberland.

# **Golden Day reminder**

On Friday we are celebrating our May Golden Day with a pirate/mermaid themed day for Nursery and a visit to Lilidorei at The Alnwick Garden for the rest of the school.

Please remember that for those heading to Alnwick school uniform is not required on the day and the children MUST be in school at 8.30am so we can be registered and sorted for a prompt departure. # **HUGGG** vouchers for children in receipt of benefit based Free School Meals

Vouchers are for food/clothes only and have to be used before the deadline which will be given in the email. Northumberland are one of only a few Local Authorities who have continued to provide these vouchers since the Covid pandemic, but it is my understanding that this will be the last time they are issued.
