## **Covid reminders and updates**

As we continue our slow path out of lockdown it certainly feels as though we are emerging slowly into something resembling a bit more like normality. We must remember though that Covid still poses a threat and that we need to remain cautious and follow the protocols and systems which have been so successful for us for all these months.

- Masks are still required to be worn by adults on the school premises during drop off and collection times (unless you are exempt for medical reasons)
- Please remember that only **one adult per child** should be on the school site and do not hang around on site or at the gates go straight home when you have collected your children!
- Indoor gatherings, parties and sleep overs etc are still not permitted with anyone outside your household/support bubble
- Lateral flow tests are still being taken by Eastlea staff twice every week. Anyone who wishes to do so can now access 'rapid tests' from pharmacies, testing sites or ordered online. Remember lateral flow tests should only be taken for those who do not have any symptoms as a way of checking that at the time of the test you are not infectious or in danger of passing on the Covid virus.
- If you or your child does have any Covid symptoms then it is important that you inform school
  immediately, seek a PCR test from a testing centre and self-isolate with your household pending
  the outcome of the test.

# Reception allocation of places for September 2021

For the first time ever this year we have families who have children attending our Eastlea Nursery who have not managed to secure a place for their child in our Reception class for September 2021. This is a very difficult situation and I know will be upsetting for those concerned. We all feel very sorry about this but it is totally out of our hands. Having taken advice there is nothing we can do to squeeze any more into Reception as there is a statutory limit called 'infant class size legislation' which means we are legally not allowed to go over our school admission number of 30 in that class. We know our Nursery is very popular, but for 2021 there happens to also be an <u>unusually</u> high number locally in this particular cohort. It happens periodically where a year group is 'full' but has not happened in this way for us before with Nursery moving into Reception. We hope we are never in the position of disappointing families like this again. If you are faced with not getting a place then please talk to me and I can go through the options regarding the waiting list and appeals process.

# Y5/Y6 July 'residential visit' update

We are still not able to 100% confirm that the planned residential visit for Year 5/Year 6 at school in July is able to go ahead. This is disappointing as I know so many children were so keen to go. Unless we have a few more who are able to take part there is a chance that without some additional bursaries/funding then we will not be able to go ahead with the 2 days of activities/overnight stay. Please let us know as soon as possible if your child would like to take part so that we can make a final decision about this next week. Fingers crossed!
