

Dear Parents/Carers.

The second half of the autumn term has started well this week and this newsletter will share some important reminders as well as details of what we have planned for the long 8 week run in to Christmas.

School Admissions for Reception 2023 – a reminder

For parents of pupils due to start in Reception <u>next</u> September please remember that the admissions portal opened on 1st November and closes on 15th January. It is very important that you complete an application for a place as soon as possible. **Even if your child currently attends our Eastlea Nursery then you** <u>must</u> make an admissions application for a place in Reception September 2023. The information about this is all on the Northumberland County Council website (school admissions) and you will receive confirmation of places on 17th April 2023. If anyone requires help with this process then please contact Mrs Shimmin or Miss Beeston in school.

Parent/Carer Questionnaire

We had an exceptionally high turnout at the parent appointments before the half term break. Appointments can still be arranged for the small number who were unable to meet their child's teacher – please just contact your child's teacher to arrange a time.

We were also delighted with the level of response to our parent/carer questionnaire with 77% of families providing feedback on 'how things are going' at Eastlea. In answer to the questions on the first page the staff were <u>very</u> proud of the outcomes in terms of the percentage of parents who agree/strongly agree:

- My child is happy in school 99%
- My child does well at Eastlea 100%
- My child feels safe at Eastlea 100%
- Eastlea has high expectations for my child 99%
- There is a good range of subjects available to my child 97%
- Eastlea supports my child's wider personal development 100%
- Eastlea staff make me aware of what my child will learn during the year 96%
- When I raise concerns, Eastlea staff deal with issues appropriately 95% (and 5% said they 'did not know' as they had not raised any issues)
- Eastlea lets me know how my child is doing in school 100%
- My child can take part in clubs and activities at Eastlea 89% (9% did not know Nursery pupils do not attend clubs)
- Eastlea makes sure its pupils are well behaved 99.5%
- Eastlea has systems in place to deal quickly and effectively with instances of bullying if they occur 79% (20% 'did not know' as they have not had any experience with this)
- I would recommend Eastlea to another parent 100%
- In addition to this, 89% of parents/carers of pupils with identified Special Educational Needs felt that
 Eastlea gave their child the support needed to succeed (11% ticked 'did not know' but did not make
 it clear whether their child had SEND issues)

In terms of the other written comments these have been shared with staff and governors. A large number of parents commented on how good the communication with parents is as well as the friendly atmosphere at Eastlea and how approachable the staff are. The personal touch shown by staff with knowledge of all pupils, a focus on health and wellbeing and support provided for families as well as children were all recognised. The wide range of opportunities in terms of extra-curricular activities and the way learning was made 'fun' was also applauded as well as the incentives such as Golden Days. Any issues raised by parents have been considered and will be addressed as appropriate. **The overwhelmingly positive response is something we never take for granted. Thank you!** Please remember that we offer an 'open door' policy at Eastlea and that if any parents do have concerns or issues to raise then we are always willing to arrange for this to happen.

Behaviour Policy



Each year we review our behaviour policy and if any amendments are made then a revised copy is provided for all parents/carers. This year there have been <u>no major changes</u> to the systems we already have in place. The policy recognises the fact that we are continuing to embed the 'THRIVE' approach in school to help support all children to manage and regulate their emotions safely. We know our school behaviour policy works very successfully and is something which receives a very positive response from parents. The full policy is on our website and hard copies can be made available from the school office if required.

Please can we remind everyone that uniform/hoodies/joggers/coats etc **must be named**. We have more than the usual number of unclaimed <u>unnamed</u> uniform items in school – and want to avoid you having to fund unnecessary replacements.

Parking

Please continue to park considerately without blocking roads/driveways and aim to use the 'park and stride' opportunity from the Church of Nazarene where possible to avoid congestion outside of school. This proved to be a more popular option during Active October and we would love it if this continued. Thank you!

Mode Star Platinum award - CONGRATULATIONS!

As we explained to the school this morning, during Active October some of the Brainwaves were delighted to meet Tracy Aitken, a Project Officer, from the Strategic Transport Team at Northumberland County Council. She came to present Eastlea with the **Platinum Mode Star Award** which recognises all we do to promote activity and sustainable ways of travel – walking, biking and cycling to school, using the Park and Stride facility from the Church of the Nazarene, encouraging children to be active in school time and promoting use of bikes for children of all ages.

Eastlea is one of the first schools to be presented with this 'top' award in Northumberland and one of only 40 schools in the country to have received the platinum award. Well done to everyone!

Use of the school field at lunchtimes – wellies required!

We have been fortunate to have a very mild start to the autumn term, but wet weather at this time of year always makes the field difficult to use as it can get muddy. In an effort to keep using the grass for as long as we can, for the next few weeks we are asking that if the children wish to bring in a pair of wellies to change into at lunchtimes it might make it possible for them to be able to access the field for a while longer. This is not compulsory, but any wellies which are brought in should be named and in a named carrier bag please.

School Lunch Menus

We are making some changes to our school lunch menus as from next week – with the start of our 'winter menu 2022'. Ms William has tried to retain the most popular dishes and added some other meals which have been chosen by the children. Copies of the menus are included in the letter (see below) and can also be found on the school website. Paper copies can be collected from the school office if this is easier. Please note that next week (w/b 7th November) is WEEK 1 of the new menu.

Breakfast Club

We know that our breakfast club facility is really popular and are aware how useful many families find this to enable them to get to work or attend appointments first thing in the morning. As the numbers of children rise who are attending the club we are having to re-look at how we organise and supervise the children in the library. We would ask that you help us out by:

- where possible booking breakfast club places in advance, e.g. this can either be a regular booking of every day/weekly on certain days, or ringing to book at the start of the week for the days you need etc. [If there is an emergency on a particular day and you suddenly need a place we will always do our best to accommodate, but it can be difficult to cater for everyone when numbers are unknown!]
- **arriving between 7.30am 8.15am** so that breakfast can be served and cleared in good time before the start of the school day.
- paying for breakfast club sessions (£2.50) on the day/week they are used so that we have enough funds available to buy the food needed for breakfasts!
