

Dear Parents/Carers,

Just a few reminders

I am very grateful for your positive involvement with our return to school process and the way that you have supported all the new protocols which have been in place to keep everyone safe.

There are a few things you can help us with to ensure things run even more smoothly...

- the start times of either 8.45am or 9am are merging into one longer arrival time in some cases. Please can we ask that unless a separate arrangement has been made due to multiple siblings in one family, pupils in Nursery/Y3/Y4/Y5/Y6 should arrive at 8.45am and those in Reception/Y1/Y2 come at 9am
- to help reduce the number of people on site there should only be one adult per child at drop off and collection times
- please try to **limit the time spent lingering** on site or around the school gates/entrance points as this reduces the opportunities for potential transitory meetings
- in many cases, children having **smaller bags** would allow for more space in the cloakroom/peg areas which will help staff in their quest to limit the number of lost/missing items
- reducing the number and size of charms/key rings/ etc attached to reading folders would also make it easier for pupils to fit their folders in their trays THANK YOU!

Thank you for your support

Despite everything that we have had to put in place in terms of keeping 'Covid secure', we have managed to have as many events and activities as possible in recent weeks which have been extremely well supported by parents/carers and families – thank you once again...

- The launch of our **Rainbow reading challenge** saw £184 raised from contributions made by the children for our reading resource funds. The theme has proved to be very popular and remember that all children are asked to read over the half term holiday next week (or practise their letter sounds in Reception) and this will ensure they get their next star on the bronze bookmark!
- Our 'Active October' activities have been superb and very well received including the Dance Blast launch event as well as our walk to school week, bike/scooter to school week which culminated in the superb Bling your bike/snazzle your scooter challenge, our Harvest Welly Walk with generous donations for Cramlington foodbank, the Year 5 Bikeability course, the return of our Daily Mile challenge and the start of our Park and Stride initiative (Smarter Parker) thanks to backing from the Church of the Nazarene.

We have just been presented with the **SILVER** Modeshift Stars Award. The silver star will be added to our plaque in the main entrance and shared with the children at the Zoom assembly this week.



Modeshift stars is the 'National School Travel Awards Scheme' established to recognise schools who have demonstrated

excellence in supporting cycling, walking and other forms of sustainable travel to promote and improve the health and wellbeing of their pupils. We had to complete 30 different initiatives linked to these areas over a period of two years.

School Admissions for Year 7 and Reception 2020 – a reminder

If you have a child due to start Year 7 next September the admissions portal is still open and any remaining applications need to be submitted straight away (deadline is 31st October). It is essential that you apply before the deadline so that a place is allocated at Cramlington Learning Village or the school of your choice.

For parents of pupils due to start in Reception <u>next</u> September the admissions portal opens on 1st November and closes on 15th January – *you will receive confirmation of places on 16th April 2021.* Please note that **even if your child is currently attending our Eastlea Nursery then you must make an admissions application for Reception** in September 2021. The information about this is all on the Northumberland County Council website (school admissions).

Advance notice of charity/school events after half term
