Sports update



As you will know from our newsletters and diary of events there continue to be lots of opportunities provided for pupils to take part in various sporting activities at Eastlea as part of the sports partnership work that is ongoing in Cramlington. The support we have from parents in terms of encouraging pupils to attend the range of different clubs/activities on offer is not something we take for granted. This half term we have had children taking part in lunchtime football, tag rugby and running clubs, the before school street dance club, selection events for the Year 5/Year 6 multi-skills and KS2 dance academy, swimming lessons for Year 4, weekly after school netball sessions, specialist led dance sessions for Year 2/Year 3 as well as a preparation in PE for skipping and gymnastics competitions.

- **Gifted and talented selection events** we have had real success with the number of pupils selected to take part in the 'academy' sessions this year more than ever before. 5 of our KS2 pupils are now representing Eastlea in the dance academy and well done to Abby who was selected to join the multiskills academy (and to Aiden who was the first reserve for the boys). Congratulations to all who took the opportunity to join in with these events!
- Our 'individual' sports stars each Tuesday we celebrate the achievements of children who are taking part in different sporting activities in their own time. We have had lots of children so far this year who have a won awards or commendations for a wide range of different sports karate, judo and dance champions, swimming stars and talented footballers...one of whom has secured a contract with a premier league team! Well done to all!
