It celebrates the fact that we have sustained a pattern of high levels of pupil achievement in our KS2 results over a number of years regardless of the background of pupils. We were the <u>only school in Northumberland</u> to be listed as a 2016 local winner and once again it is super to have the hard work of the whole Eastlea team recognised in such a high profile way.

# **Outer Space Reading Challenge**

Our outer space reading challenge is being very well supported. We have lots of children who have reached their bronze award – with the current total running at 184 (our best yet at this stage of the year by some margin)!! Many are nearing their silver award...and if your child reads in the half term holiday then this counts for a 'sticker' and we hope to reward our first 'silver' winners at the beginning of March!

#### Sports update

As you will know from our newsletters and diary of events there continue to be lots of opportunities provided for pupils to take part in various sporting activities at Eastlea as part of the sports partnership work that is ongoing in Cramlington. I would like to thank the many parents who have encouraged their children to take part in the lunchtime football, rugby rocket tots, or running clubs; before school street dance club, swimming lessons for Year 4, weekly after school rugby or netball sessions; basketball, skipping, hula hooping and rugby coaching lessons and the Year 5/Year 6 multi-skills and KS2 dance academy selection events all of which have taken place this half term.



In particular I also wanted to mention:

- Eagles basketball match this social event has now become an annual occasion and was enjoyed by
  a group 56 pupils, parents, staff and families earlier in January. The Eagles were comfortable winners
  in their match against the Surrey Scorchers and at half time the Year 5 Eastlea basketball team won the
  'Cramlington Cup' in a nail biting penalty shoot-out against Shanklea Primary! Well done!
- Year 3/4 gymnastics in which a team of 6 pupils took part in the area school games competition we did not win, but the determination, enjoyment and team work shown were a credit to those taking part!
- **Gifted and talented selection events** we have had a total of 19 pupils taking part in the 'try outs' for KS2 dance and Y5/Y6 multi-skills this half term. Creditable scores were achieved by those completing the multi-skills challenges and 3 of our dancers from Year 4 and Year 6 were chosen to represent Eastlea in the 'dance academy' sessions which will take place next half term on Wednesdays after school at Beaconhill. Well done to all who took the opportunity to join in with these events!

We have lots planned for the next half term including the continuation of the popular before school, lunchtime and after school clubs as well as school games football and netball competitions, the Year 5 skipping festival and Sport Relief activities.
