

Dear Parents/Carers,

As I am sure you have come to expect, every week there seems to be a new national announcement relating to schools which then impacts on the provision we can offer at Eastlea. This week, which marks the <u>12th week</u> of our 'closure' has been no exception!! Now we know for definite, what had been clear to us all for a long time, that due to the social distancing restrictions in place we will <u>not</u> be able to welcome ALL children back in ALL classes full time before the end of the summer term and have to hope that the government's vision of trying to ensure things look far more 'normal' for September can be realised. I really do hope that this is what happens – but that is 11 weeks away and it would be wrong to look too far ahead yet, as so much can (and understandably, will) change during this time.

How are things going so far with Eastlea's expanded provision?

Once again I am pleased to note that we have had another successful week as we have welcomed back more children to Eastlea. It has been especially lovely to see the smiling faces of our Nursery pupils who were very keen to 'bounce' into Nursery for their sessions this week and see Mrs Shimmin and the team of Early Years staff again! We have also welcomed a few more children into our Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 'bubbles' as well as some into our vulnerable/key worker groups. Everyone has tried so hard to follow the new schedules and restrictions and we are very proud of them all.

As from next week we will be having our younger Nursery pupils back to school for either one full day (Tuesdays) or two half days (Thursday/Friday afternoons) per week. The arrangements for this and practical advice on where to come in, which gate and at what time were shared with those involved last week and we look forward to seeing you all soon. The Nursery visits for our newest members of the 'Eastlea family' also took place successfully on Tuesday 9th this week and once again everyone has been very careful to follow our guidance and take the necessary safety and hygiene precautions – THANK YOU!
