

Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back for the second half of the autumn term. I hope everyone had a good half term break and has returned ready for the eight school weeks which take us up to Christmas! This newsletter contains some important reminders/information as well as advanced notice of forthcoming events and feedback from the latest parental questionnaire.

PE kits

Considering our continuing focus on PE/Sport, it is important that all children have a named PE kit in school during the week so that whenever PE lessons/sports coaching sessions occur, the children are suitably prepared. As the cooler winter weather arrives the children should have suitable outdoor trainers and can also wear plain dark tracksuit bottoms to keep warm. Your support with this is appreciated.

Behaviour Policy



Each year we review our behaviour policy and if any amendments are made then a revised copy is provided for all parents/carers. This year there have been <u>no significant changes</u> to the systems we already have in place. Additional information in the policy recognises the fact that we are now embedding the 'THRIVE' approach in school to help support all children to manage and regulate their emotions safely. We know our school behaviour policy works very successfully and is something which receives a very positive response from parents.

The full policy, with the minor amendments, is now on our website and hard copies are available from the school office if required.

School Lunches

As explained before the holiday, the winter menus started this week on the usual 3 weekly cycle. Further copies of the menus are available from the office.

Nursery applications

We are now looking ahead to preparing for the next group of children who will be starting Nursery at Eastlea in the spring term. If you have a pre-school child, or know someone who does, and would like an application form to secure their place here please come to the school office to collect a form. These can be completed well in advance and confirmation will be sent out when the form is received to confirm the child's place and their starting date. School Admissions for Reception

If you have a child due to start Reception next September the county admissions portal opens on 5th November and applications need to be submitted straight away (deadline is 15th January). **It is essential that you apply in good time so that a place is allocated at Eastlea, even if your child already attends our Nursery**. Parent Questionnaire

We were delighted with the level of response to our recent parent/carer questionnaire with 70% of families providing feedback on 'how things are going' at Eastlea. In answer to the questions on the first page the staff were again very proud of the following outcomes in terms of the percentage of parents who agree/strongly agree:

- My child is happy in school 98%
- My child is will looked after 99%
- My child feels safe 100%
- My child makes good progress 98%
- My child is taught well 98%
- My child receives appropriate homework for their age 98%
- Eastlea is well led and managed 100%
- Staff respond well to any concerns I raise 97%
- I receive valuable information from staff about my child's progress 99%
- Eastlea provides a good range of additional opportunities for pupils 100%
- Eastlea makes sure its pupils are well behaved 96%
- Systems are in place to deal effectively with instances of bullying if they occur **85%** (with a further **13%** 'not sure' as they have not had any experience with this!)
- Would you recommend Eastlea to another parent 98%

In terms of the other written comments these have been shared with staff and governors. Many parents commented on the number of positive opportunities provided for pupils, the success of our Golden Days and behaviour reward systems, the fact that there is a wide range of 'fun' educational experiences on offer, our good communication and the fact that staff are friendly, approachable and always available to discuss concerns. Any issues raised by parents have been considered and will be addressed as appropriate and the overwhelming positive response is something we do not take for granted. Thank you! Please remember that we offer an 'open door' policy at Eastlea and that if any parents do have concerns or issues to raise then we are always willing to arrange for this to happen.

Parents congregating at the school gates

One of the concerns raised by parents in recent weeks has been the issue of adults congregating at the school gates first thing in the morning when children are being dropped off both here and at Kids Club. This can cause difficulties with the entrance way being blocked and has led to complaints about the use of inappropriate language and smoking/vaping which I know I have already outlined in previous letters. I'm sure everyone will agree that we do not want children/parents/carers to have to hear bad language as they come into school or have to enter through a 'cloud of smoke'. We are taking further advice on how this issue can be addressed and your continued support with helping to avoid these problems is appreciated – thank you!

Attendance and punctuality

We are continuing to have real success in terms of encouraging good punctuality and attendance at Eastlea, but there is still room for some improvement! I hope you will be interested in the following 'headlines' from the first half of the autumn term:

Year 5 have yet to win either the attendance trophy or the punctuality plaque – something to aim for this half term!

- Year 2 won our overall award for the best attendance for the first half of the autumn term in total they
 won the weekly trophy three times with 100% and their average for the half term was 97.97% well
 done!
- Year 6 were the winners of the certificate for the **best punctuality** with only 6 'lates' recorded in total during the half term!
- We have plenty of pupils who are on track to gain individual 100% attendance certificates for the autumn term and I hope they have a healthy eight weeks in the run up to the Christmas holiday!

Children whose percentage attendance falls <u>below 90%</u> are classified by the government as 'persistent absentees' and as a school we are obliged to send separate letters to the families of those individuals who fell below this figure in the first half of the autumn term; as well as those who dropped below 92% to alert them to the potential issue. If anyone wishes to discuss this further, please contact me in school.

Residential visits

A final reminder that for those who made alternative arrangements to pay the deposit and secure a place for their child on the forthcoming residential visits for Year 5 and Year 6 that this money is now due as soon as possible. We will be in contact with parents who have not yet responded so that final numbers can be confirmed.
