- **Reception** won our overall award for the best attendance by a clear margin for the first half of the summer term and their average for the half term was 98.98% well done! Year 1 were second with 96.74%.
- Year 3 won the certificate for the **best punctuality** during the half term congratulations! Year 2 and Year 4 were joint second.
- As a school we try hard to maintain a low level of 'persistent absentees'. We have only 12 pupils currently at Eastlea with **attendance below 90%** which is something we are very pleased with.

Success and achievement so far this term

Although the first half of the summer term seemed to pass very quickly – just 5 weeks in total – there were plenty of things to celebrate for Eastlea pupils.

• **Football** – our Year 5/4 team took part in a school games competition on 24th April and did superbly well, finishing as joint winners. In the end due to goal difference, Eastlea came 'second' but we were very proud of the team and they were rewarded with medals in assembly for their commitment, determination and team spirit. Well done!

- Rugby we had real success with the rugby competitions which took place on 22nd May. The Year 4 teams played well in the morning and were a credit to the school. In the afternoon the two Year 6 teams both got through to their respective finals (for both the shield and the cup competitions). They were the only Cramlington team to achieve this and were up against teams from Seaton Valley. Unfortunately, we were pipped in the final by a 'golden try' in extra time but we did come away as winners of the School Games Values award which recognised the determination, respect, self-belief, honesty, teamwork and passion shown during the competition congratulations!
- Woodland Trust Silver award thanks to the efforts of our Woodland Walk club and the involvement of wide range of pupils in finding out more about the natural environment, Eastlea was awarded the 'silver' award for the Woodland Trust initiative last month. A special plaque is displayed on our 'achievements' shelves in the main entrance. You may have spotted an article in the News Post Leader last week about this except that they were highlighting the 'bronze' award which we achieved months ago...we now have the 'silver' and have our fingers crossed for 'gold'!!
- Year 2 Secret Agent Training and Year 6 SATs superstars May is always a busy month for Year 2 and Year 6 as they complete the end of key stage national assessments. They all worked extremely hard during this time and we know that they have done their very best. Well done!
- Year 6 Eco-schools visit to Nissan as part of their science work on renewable energy, a visit to the Nissan factory was arranged for Year 6 on 26th April. This was a 'new' visit for the school and Eastlea created a really good first impression! We had lots of very positive feedback from the engineers who ran the sessions about how enthusiastic and committed the children were as well as how much effort they had put into their pre-visit work including designs for the new Leaf car and working models of wind turbines which were then tested while they were there. A test drive in the Leaf car was also a major highlight for the pupils!!
- Year 6 'Sky Ocean Rescue' plastic pollution pledge Regional winners as part of the Year 6 work on recycling, the children focused on plastic pollution and how it affects the environment and in particular our oceans. This is what led to the Brainwaves organising our recycling station and starting to recycle plastic bottles and bottle tops. The bottle tops have been used to make Maths times-table games for the different classes. Photos of the games and the work we had done were submitted to the Sky Ocean Rescue competition and we were delighted to find out that we had been selected as the regional competition winners! As you may know this resulted in the children winning an all-expenses paid visit to the Sky Academy Studios in London on Tuesday 21st May to make a short film about our pledge! It was an amazing experience for the children and something I am sure they will never forget! Congratulations to them all!

School summer menus

The summer menus are due to start next week (w/b 10th June = Week 1 etc). Copies of the menus are attached and we are sure that the choices on offer will be things that the children will enjoy. Even if your child normally has a packed lunch, if there is something they would like to try from the menu, then they are more than welcome to order a school dinner on any day they wish. The cost is £2.30 a day for those who pay for meals (or £2.00 for Nursery pupils).
