Dear Parent

You may be aware that the Local Authority has been exploring ways in which to improve outcomes for children in all Northumberland schools. One of the ways that they hope to help achieve this is by improving the quality of information shared between schools when children transfer between phases or just move schools. Obviously, some schools and partnerships have excellent arrangements in place but the quality and accuracy of data does vary and we need to develop a simple method of validating the assessments before transfer.

Considerable thought has gone into how the Local Authority can help with this issue and the decision has been taken that the application of an additional short test in both reading and maths at Year 4 and Year 8 would provide an externally assessed set of baseline data that, along with other school assessment, will enhance the information available about each child. Additionally, the information will help provide a County wide picture of the achievement of children in all our schools.

The actual tests chosen are of a multi-choice variety and specifically designed to allow for ease of access and detailed analysis of the individual child's achievement. There will be a Numeracy test lasting 45 minutes and a Literacy test lasting 30 minutes. The opportunity will be there to study the analysis of data and help plan should any significant gaps be identified.

The tests will be administered with as little disruption as possible and no specific preparation will be required. The tests should be regarded as a normal part of the school's delivery of the curriculum and assessment of progress.
