



Dear Parents/Carers,

★ EASTER GOLDEN DAY! ★

Today we started the countdown to the next 'Golden Day' which will take place on the day the children break up for the Easter holidays – **Thursday 2nd April 2026**. Staff are again planning an 'Easter themed' Golden Day and there will be several fun activities during the day which we are sure that the children will enjoy.

So what exactly will be happening?

- **A NON-UNIFORM DAY FOR EVERYONE!** (*no particular theme – just something casual...and NO fine to pay!!*)
- Class based **Easter craft activities and challenges** for different age ranges
- **Easter games** such as 'pin the tail on the bunny', egg and spoon races etc
- An **Easter egg hunt** – within the school grounds – fingers crossed for more of the spring like weather!
- **Easter raffle to be drawn in each class...** tickets for this were sent home last week – and there are more available from the school office if anyone wants them (£1 per strip!)
- **Lunchtime** – school dinners or packed lunches will be eaten in the school hall as usual, but the menu for that day will be the '**FRIDAY MEAL of something and chips**'!! This is always a popular option for Golden Days.
N.B. If your child wishes to have the school dinner on Thursday 2nd then they must make sure they inform their class teacher when the dinner register is taken so that any changes to the lunchtime meal pattern can be amended on the online system for that day! Payments of £2.50 (KS2) or £2.20 (Nursery) must be received by Thursday at the latest so that the dinner payments can be balanced for the end of term. THANK YOU!
- **For all pupils from Reception to Year 6 (plus full day Nursery pupils) we will finish the day early for our Easter holidays and the children will head home at 2pm** (I think they see this as the biggest treat of all!!) [*Morning Nursery pupils should be collected at 11.45am as usual*]



And the best news, as always, is that there will be no additional charge for the activities on the day. **The children do not have to bring in any money for coming in non-uniform, or the Easter activities.** This is their treat for trying hard with their behaviour this half term.

As always attendance on our Golden Days is dependent on each child following the Eastlea rules in school and at lunchtimes. We are hoping to include all children; however, for those who are struggling to follow the rules, we have been or will be in contact with parents to discuss ways to support children to get them 'back on track' in terms of behaviour.
